

Optional Teacher Materials

Overview

These materials are for teachers to use after Lesson 3. Included are instructions and a handout for review sessions.

Review—For Teachers

- A. Spend spare minutes in the class day reviewing this lesson by asking:
- What are the main steps in the juvenile court system? (*The steps are arrest, juvenile hall, released or stay in juvenile hall, petition, arraignment, trial (not open to the public), and sentencing hearing.*)
 - What are some differences between the juvenile justice system and the adult system? (*Juveniles are taken to juvenile hall and adults are taken to jail, In the juvenile system there is no jury and the proceedings are private, but in the adult system there is a jury and the proceedings are open to the public. The juvenile system focus is on rehabilitation whereas the adult system focuses on punishment, etc.*)
 - When are juveniles treated the same as adult offenders? (*When they commit terrible crimes e.g. murder.*) Do you think this is right? Explain.
- B. Distribute Handout 3E. This is a puzzle based on this lesson. When students complete it, review the answers.
